FOUNDATION STAGE

Next term in English, we will be... reading Eliot Jones, Midnight Superhero by Anne Cottringer and A Superhero Like you by Dr Ranj. Our theme is (you guessed it!) Superheroes and people who help us. We will also continue learning new graphemes and digraphs in phonics and have lots of fun in drawing club.

In Maths, we will be

playing dice games to consolidate our understanding of order and investigating pairs of numbers that make 5. We will also be exploring numbers that are made up of '5 and a bit.' Using the language of more than, fewer than and an equal number, we will be teaching how to describe how many objects there are in each set.

To support next term's learning, we would recommend talking and listening to the people in your family who are real-life Superheroes. You could also get involved with recycling at home and when you're out and about.

Over the holidays,

please continue to practise phonics with the home learning sheets. You could also help your child to fasten and unfasten their coat zip, share stories with one another, practise writing their name together and play lots of games!

YEAR1

Next term in English, we will be... reading Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers. This is a story about friendship. We will be writing instructions and character descriptions, as well as our own story about losing something and then finding it again. After that, we will be using Cave Baby to practise writing labels and captions and narrative retelling.

In Maths, we will be... separating numbers into ones and tens. We will also be adding and subtracting using the ones column first and then the tens. We will be recognising basic 2D shapes and 3D shapes in our environment and grouping them using different criteria. At the end of the half term we will be comparing height and length.

To support next term's learning, we would recommend visiting a zoo and taking a trip to the library to read some nonfiction books on Arctic animals. Please also help them to practise counting forwards and backwards to 20.

Over the holidays,

please keep reading all the e-book library books you have. Please also practise the sounds they have learnt this half term using the Little Wandle phonics sheets in their homework books and have fun playing lots of games together during the festive period.

We hope you have a fantastic break and come back excited for our spring learning.

YEAR 2

Next term in English, we will be... reading The Bear and the Piano by David Litchfield. We will be learning to write letters of advice, short news reports and our own narratives of the story.

In Maths, we will be looking at multiplication and division of the 2,5 and 10 times tables. Our maths targets for the half term are to recall their 2,5 and 10 times tables and be able to count in 3s!

To support next term's learning, we would recommend going to the library and reading for pleasure as much as possible. It would also be nice to ao on winter walks and have fun in the park too.... We have been looking at different types of trees in English, as part of a factual report, so it would be great to go tree spotting or even on a bear hunt!

Over the holidays,

try to read together every day and practice learning their 2s, 5s and 10s timetables. They would also benefit from practising some addition and subtraction sums in the column method.



YEAR3

Next term in English, we will be... reading poems selected from Carol Ann Duffy's collection. We will be looking for patterns in poetry and how to use poetic devices. We will also be studying The Barnabus Project by the Fan Brothers.

Our topic work with be focused on the cities of London and New York and we will be creating art work inspired by artist Paul Klee.

In Maths, we will be multiplying 2-digit numbers with 1 digit numbers and learning our 3, 4 and 8 timetables to correspond with equivalent division facts.

To support next term's learning, we would recommend visiting the local library and exploring books written by Emily Gravett.

YEAR4

Next term in English, we will be... we will be reading Winter's Child by Angela McAllister, in this unit children will explore and immerse themselves in the theme of the story. making predictions about what might happen if you are not careful what you wish for. Children continue to explore the themes and language of the text, particularly identifying noun phrases and prepositional phrases and how they are used to create images. Children go on to predict what might happen after the story, as it becomes spring, and write their own simple sequel, applying the grammatical skills learnt.

In Maths, we will be using the multiplication and division skills we have learnt this half term to help us with formal methods for multiplication and division.

Over the holidays,

please encourage your children to read and complete TT rockstars every day.

If we get very cold weather or snow over the Christmas break it would be good if children could go for a walk in a park to experience a walk on a winters day.

YEAR5

Next term in English, we will be... reading The Lost Thing, a fantasy narrative which teaches children about belonging and equality. Children will be writing diary entries, formal letters, adverts, character descriptions, setting descriptions AND non-chronological reports. Lots of exciting writing happening!

In Maths, we will be interpreting graphs to begin with and then moving onto comparing and ordering fractions.

To support next term's learning, we would recommend reading as much as possible either together or independently and encouraging children to practise their times tables regularly to keep up their skills.

Over the holidays,

children have been given some fun tasks to complete that relate to next terms *Space* topic. Please encourage them to complete these tasks, as they will help with their springtime learning.



YEAR 6

Next term in English, we will be... starting our first reading unit from Literacy Tree, using the book The Little Match Girl Strikes back to inspire our learning for spring 2024.

In Maths, we will be continuing to work hard with fractions and decimals and kick-starting our measurement unit with lots of unit conversion practise for time, length, mass and volume.

Our Attendance for this half term

is 92%. This is way below our expectations and the National average. So many children are not achieving their potential due to unnecessary absences.

Reaching their potential

Attending school is essential to ensure your child reaches their full potential. Learning is vital at every stage. If content is missed, it is very hard to catch up and this will impact on future learning.

Getting to school on time

Please ensure your child arrives on time, everyday. Gates open and learning starts promptly at 8.40am. Gates close at 8.50am. Later than this and you must take your child into school via the school office and provide a reason for your late arrival.

If your child does not attend school, they will be recorded as absent. This will either be authorised or unauthorised. Both count towards a lower percentage score. You must call every day, before 9am if your child is absent.
